# **Becoming Catholic through the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA)**

Welcome to the *My Catholic Life! Series!* This series provides a complete and faithful summary of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* in an easy-to-read format. It also presents our faith in a personal and understandable way.

All participants seeking communion with the Catholic Church will be required to fill out the RCIA registration/questionnaire form, linked below. All forms are kept private. Any past marriages or annulments require immediate attention if catechumen/ candidate wishes to enter into full communion with the church on April 17, 2022. Below is the suggested 24 week format and schedule covering the entire *Catechism of the Catholic Church*. You will also use this Small Group Study format (meetings are on Mondays, see schedule below):

6:30- 6:35 pm – Gather & socialize.

6:35-6:45 pm – Opening prayer and Scripture as provided in each session guide. 6:45-7:15 pm – Presentation on assigned chapter (Chapter should be read before meeting) Video if appropriate and GOOD.

7:15- 7:50 pm Small Group discussion questions. Each person should be invited to share something or ask a question if he/she chooses to. Avoid having one or two persons dominate the discussion. Go around the circle and do not be afraid to share! Your insights may assist someone else in their understanding of the topics. Your question may very well be the same question someone else may have. 7:50- 8 pm – Brief introduction to next weeks Chapter and Closing Prayer
